CCARA wins funding for air quality monitor

CCARA was recently awarded funding for an air quality monitor for Beckenham High Street through the [Breathe London](#) Community Programme. Public awareness of air quality across London has increased a lot in the last few years, but we mostly rely on modelled data to estimate the extent of air pollution in the local area. Measuring air quality in Beckenham and making this information available to local residents, businesses and councillors will help to improve our understanding of how clean the air is, and how this changes over time. A stunning vision for Camden Park

The transformed entrance grounds for Camden Place are not a proposal but the outcome of an academic exercise by Katie Brown, undertaken for her dissertation as part of an RHS design course.

Katie chose to research and develop a scheme that would transform the entrance of Camden Place into elaborate and grand gardens, befitting a Grade II* listed English country house, with its French connections. New spaces, journeys and vistas have been imagined to meet the requirements of golf and social members, private residents and event visitors.

Research and inspiration came from the house's history but also the arts and the work of other garden designers.

We are delighted that Katie has agreed to share her design work and the process at a talk on **Wednesday 25th October at 2pm, Camden Place.**

If you are interested in garden design, want to learn about the research process or would like to see what Camden Place could be like if there was an unlimited budget, then you should join us.

A charge of £5 a head will generate a small fund to add to the Camden Place garden planting budget.

Bromley Council 'Treemendous' planting initiative

In 2021, the Council embarked on their ambitious tree planting programme and committed to planting an additional 5000 street trees over four years. Amazing progress has been made and a total of 4,642 trees have been planted so far.

Trees are chosen to fit their surroundings, provide shading and give colour and vibrancy to our streets all year round.

Funding Opportunities



FUNDER: Energy Saving Trust - Grants available for Youth Climate Action Projects (Northern Ireland, Scotland, Wales, and the North East and North West of England)

DEADLINE: 27th October 2023 (A short expression of interest form due by 16 October 2023)

AWARD: up to £40,000 over two years.

AREA: The Energy Saving Trust Foundation and Airbnb are funding a new round of grants for youth-led climate action projects. The Youth Climate Action Fund is open to organisations in Northern Ireland, Scotland, Wales, and the North East and North West of England that work with young people experiencing inequality.

The fund supports a wide range of projects, such as practical environmental work, carbon reduction initiatives, education and awareness programmes, or advocacy and campaigning. The goal of the fund is to empower young people to take action on the climate emergency.

To be eligible to apply:

- Organisations must already be working with children and young people experiencing inequality.
- Organisations must have an annual income for the last financial year of less than £1 million.
- Below are some examples of projects that could be funded by the Youth Climate Action Fund:
- A project that teaches young people about climate change and how they can reduce their impact on the environment.
- A project that helps young people install solar panels on their homes or schools.
- A project that organises a climate strike or other event to raise awareness about climate change.
- A project that advocates for climate policies at the local or national level.

FUNDER: The Woodland Trust - Free Trees for Schools & Community Groups (UK)

DEADLINE: Applications are expected to close in January 2024, or sooner depending on stock availability.

AWARD: Tree packs

AREA: Hundreds of thousands of trees are being given away to help the UK reach its 2050 carbon net-zero target. Schools, nurseries, colleges, universities, outdoor learning centres, and other groups such as resident associations, sports clubs, parish councils, scouts and guides from across the UK are among the organisations eligible to apply for up to 420 trees to improve their local environment.

Tree packs available include:

- hedge,
- year-round colour,
- wildlife,
- copse,
- working wood,
- urban trees.
- wild harvest,
- wild wood,

Applications can be made for up to four separate tree packs as long as the total does not exceed 420 trees.

The Woodland Trust is currently taking applications for trees to be delivered in March 2024.

Applications are not currently being accepted from Northern Ireland.

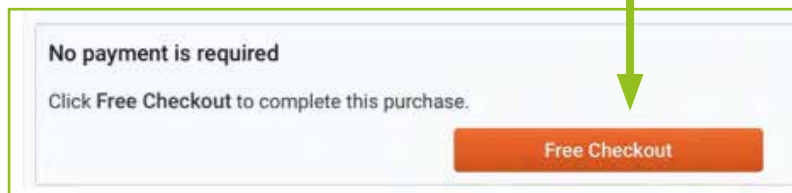

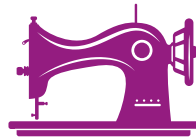
